Controlling tough weeds

Whilst most gardeners consider spring and summer to be the best season to tackle weeds, some forget that autumn also provides an ideal opportunity. Perfect for use during early autumn, Roundup XL Tough & Deep Root is specifically formulated to treat persistent and deep-rooted weeds. Its systemic action takes the formula right down to the weeds growing points, and put simply, kills the weed from the inside out.

The new Roundup XL Tough and Deep Root Killer 5-litre pull-and-spray is ideal for treating large areas of tough weeds and the easy action trigger gives you 15 seconds of continuous spraying.

The 1-litre spray has two patterns. The jet is ideal for targeting the centre of rosette weeds like thistles and dandelions. The fan has a foaming option so you can see where you have sprayed and, because it will not drip, you won't accidentally damage your plants.

Some tough weeds (e.g. Horsetail, Ground Elder, Japanese Knotweed) may need a repeat treatment if re-growth appears.

Roundup recommends:

Control tough weeds with Roundup XL Tough and Deep Root:

Brambles: In order to win the war against more woody weeds, such as brambles, it is best to cut them back and spray them with Roundup XL Tough & Deep Root as they re-shoot again in September when there are several open leaves. This plant is particularly hardy so may need repeat applications the following season.

Nettles: For the best results nettles should be sprayed at or just after flowering, but before they begin to die back, usually in June. Mature nettles should be cut back in the summer and allowed to re-grow before being sprayed with Roundup XL Tough and Deep Root in August or September. Larger patches may require treatment the following year to prevent re-growth.

Horsetail: The patented action of Roundup XL Tough and Deep Root allows for good penetration even through the way coating on Horsetail. Use in mid July for best effect and then treat any re-growth which occurs in early September.

TIP Treat tough weeds with a couple of applications of Roundup XL Tough and Deep Root in the autumn and save yourself lots of hard work in the spring.
